When I first looked over my procedure book a little over a year ago, I realized that communication in one form or another is what helps keep OLLI rolling along.



The force behind our success is an army of volunteers—the sharp-eyed editors; the loyal and untiring mailing crew; the creative person who maintains the scrapbook of OLLI events; the dedicated coordinators who submit announcements and flyers for the bulletin board; the compassionate member who sends thoughtful cards; and the website committee, webmaster and editors who diligently keep us up-to-date on what's going on at OLLI. This adds up to a lot of communication. It seems to me that it would take a great deal of effort not to know what's happening.

Let's follow a ChroniCLE publication. Each issue spotlights an OLLI member. This involves an interview by one of the editors. In addition, articles submitted by program coordinators, board members, or event chairpersons are reviewed, edited, and passed to the office for final layout and printing. Printed ChroniCLE pages are turned over to the mailing crew to collate, fold, label and prepare for mailing.

The OLLI website is always a work in progress. All the information found in the Blue Book is entered onto the website at the beginning of the semester, but it does not remain stagnant. It is constantly updated with program changes and announcements. A Webmaster supported by an editorial staff manages the website, with technical support from the Website Committee. 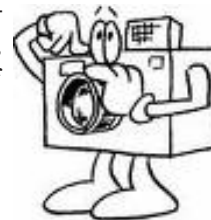

works with Glen Simar to plan and organize both short-term and long-term trips. The Trips Committee meets on the second Wednesday of each month from noon-1:15 p.m.. Each semester, the Curriculum Committee develops a matrix consisting of meeting times and rooms that are available throughout the weeks of a semester. Through an iterative process, the committee fills this matrix and write-ups for the OLLI Blue Book are collected and eventually published.

Since OLLI programs are the heart of the organization, and to make the process less burdensome for the Curriculum Committee (and future VP of Programs) my major task this year is to create an infrastructure that will assure that more OLLI members, especially those that have expertise and passions for the broad range of OLLI programs, contribute to the planning and implementation of OLLI curricula. The OLLI-CSUF membership consists of many talented and accomplished individuals who could contribute their skills and expertise to OLLI, and with more people helping, the task of continually offering intellectually stimulating programs and trips, while increasing the repertoire of courses, would be greatly facilitated. The OLLI-CSUF Long Range Planning Committee has made two recommendations that affect our programs: 1) to align our curriculum with member preferences based on surveys of the membership; and 2) to support an emerging model of retirement by providing more volunteering opportunities within the CSUF community. I will be holding an OLLI Open Meeting at the Eclectics II session on Thursday, September 24th at two Coordinators to make it possible for one to cover for the other in case of emergencies or when one needs to be out of town. Again, the more people involved, the easier the tasks will be! OLLI programs need YOU!

Learn Social Networking

“When I first signed up for Facebook, I started hearing from people who were my classmates back when I was in high school,” says Don Lake. “It’s a great vehicle for networking, keeping in touch with friends and family, and re-discovering people you’ve lost track of.”



Don, who retired after many years as Director of the Center for Distance and Online Learning with the L.A. County Office of Education, is excited to be the coordinator for a new class where OLLI members can learn more about technology resources such as Facebook.

Social Networking: The Ups and Downs of Staying Connected Online is set for Sept. 16 at 1:15 p.m. in Shapiro Wing CD. The speaker is Cynthia Gautreau, Ed.D., an assistant professor in CSUF’s Department of Elementary and Bilingual Education. This class is the first in a five-part series entitled *Impact of Technology, Online Distance Learning and Instructional Technology*.



Social network sites such as Facebook have “taken off as a vehicle for communication for the younger generation,” Don says. “But you see people of all ages on Facebook. It’s a place where parents and grandparents can share pictures of their children as well as anecdotes with friends and family. It’s a nice way to communicate and it’s easy to do. All you need is a computer and Internet access.”

Other topics in the OLLI series include: *World of Warcraft; Building Real-World Skills through Virtual World Gaming; Get a (Second) Life! Teaching and Living Challenges with Online Communities; Services Offered by UEE Distance Education, CSUF; Exploring the Field of Online Distance Learning*.

Don says this provides an opportunity for OLLI members to learn more about these new technologies and the impact they have on our society. While he’s not expecting everyone who attends the “World of Warcraft” class to develop their own “Avatar” to interact with thousands of other players, he believes people will enjoy learning more about Internet gaming and how it works.

Help for Hoarding and Clutter

More than a million Americans suffer from hoarding and the resulting clutter, according to the National Study Group on Chronic Disorganization.

If you or a loved one long for a less cluttered life, you can find help in “Hoarding and Cleaning Out the Clutter” from 9:30 a.m.-12 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 26. The class will meet in the Shapiro Wing of the Ruby Gerontology Center (RGC).



“People who are hoarders tend to hold onto everything because they feel there is a use for it,” says Penny Lambright, owner of Clutter Cleaners and a presenter at the OLLI event. “They see value in things other people see as trash. And because they see value in everything, clutter becomes a huge issue.”

Those who attend the OLLI program will get a better understanding of hoarding and clutter, as well as information on how to get started on organizing their lives. Lambright says her two previous OLLI presentations have drawn quite a crowd. “There were family members coming to learn how to help their loved ones, hoarders, and others who were just interested in the topic.”

It’s important for people who have a hoarding and clutter problem to know that they are not alone, according to Lambright. “They need to understand that there is help out there. Some people don’t know where to start and the embarrassment factor stops them from seeking help.”

As part of her mission to set people on a path to a less cluttered life, Lambright will provide those attending the OLLI class with a checklist and tips on how to start dealing with this difficult problem.
